## A Classic for all Seasons

<u>A log cabin block</u> is a classic one. Combinations of these blocks can create different patterns. Master this basic block and then combine to a myriad of variations. Some popular ones are a simple straight setting; Barn Raising; Fields and Furrows, and Flying Geese. Enjoy - Linda McNeely & Heidi Swanson

We will use a traditional red center to represent the hearth and surround that center with a scrappy pattern of lights and darks.

Technique = Building block, Design Combinations Block finished size of 14 ½ " square ¼" Seam allowance

#### **Fabrics & Cutting**


This is a great project to use up any 2 ½" strips you may have from the October meeting.


#### CUT

#### **ALL WIDTHS ARE 2 ½ INCHES!**

- 1. RED Center 2 ½" square
- 2. Light 2 ½" square
- 3. Light 4 1/2" long
- 4. Dark 4 ½" long
- 5. Dark 6 ½" long
- 6. Light 6 ½" long
- 7. Light 8 ½" long
- 7. Light 0/2 long
- 8. Dark 8 ½" long
- 9. Dark 10 1/2" long
- 10. Light 10 1/2" long
- 11. Dark 12 ½" long
- 12. Light 12 1/2" long
- 13. Dark 14 ½" long







#### **Assembly**

- a. Sew RED and light 2 ½" squares together. Light square should be to left of red center.
- b. Sew #3 to top of RED/light combo.
- c. Sew # 4 to the right side of new 4 ½" combo with RED block in the center
- d. Continue sewing strips in a clockwise fashion using the cut strips and the numbers sequence in the photo.
