Saturday 11:00-11:30	Four Patch Possibilities	Lyn S. Hill	New to quilting? This is the place to start. Learn to make a simple four-patch quilt block.
Saturday 12:15-12:45	Simple Quilts From Simple Pieces	Marcie Brenner	Learn how to create beautiful quilts from the easiest of pieces. Beginners to experienced quilters can pick up tricks. See how to cut using a variety of rotary tools. Fast sewing techniques make it easy and fun.
Saturday 2:00-2:30	The Perfect Finish	Jody Leight	Tips and techniques for binding your quilt. Learn to make and apply a perfect bias binding with no headaches and no wasted fabric.
Saturday 3:00-3:30	Shaded Four-Patch	Kate Haller	A relatively simple block with only four pieces can yield a wealth of design possibilities. Learn how to piece it accurately, see some gorgeous samples, and get some great ideas on different ways to put them together.

Coski's article o Mile-A-Minute Quilts in the Winter 2000 issue of <u><a href="#">American Quilter</a></u> gave me a new approach to scrap quilting. If you are not familiar with it come to the demonstration because it is something every quilter who is faced with bags of scraps needs to know about. You'll see samples of finished quilts, a demonstration of the technique, and you'll have an opportunity to ask questions.
Sunday 1:30-2:00	Flying Geese	Debbie Breckenridge	With this technique, you can make fast, accurate Flying Geese Blocks - <i>without</i> any special tools or foundation papers
Sunday 2:30-3:00	Super-Sized Nine Patch Quilts	Anita Grossman Solomon	For this quilt pattern, each fabric is cut just two times with a rotary cutter. Using three fabrics and swapping the cut pieces yields three baby quilts in no time at all.
